

Best Management Practices for Palletizing

- Put monitors of similar size together for stable stacking
- Place intact monitors in layers, with 9 or 12 units per layer
- To prevent breakage do not stack the monitor face down on pallets
- Starting from the bottom up tightly shrink wrap the monitors onto the pallet

e-Rack™

- Maximum 20 – 22 Units depending on the size
- Maximum of Approximately 800 – 900 lbs
- 27" + Televisions/Monitors or Large Electronic Waste Items should be Palletized
- Each e-Recycling Rack is labeled with Asset Numbers and Tare Weights
- If for some reason an e-Recycling Rack is overfilled make sure to Shrink Wrap the front sliding door prior to pick up



Organizing the Material

Item Description	Container Type	Instructions
27" < CRT Monitors	e-Rack and or Pallet	Similar sizes stack face-in. Rotate top-to-bottom. You can break plastic stabilizer to maximize efficiencies.
27" > CRT Monitors	Palletize	Similar sizes stack face-in. Rotate top-to-bottom. You can break plastic stabilizer to maximize efficiencies.
27" < CRT TV's	e-Rack and or Pallet	Similar sizes stack face-in.
27" > CRT TV's	Palletize	Similar sizes stack face-in.
Large Console and Oversized Monitors	Palletize	Face-in.
CPU's	e-Rack and or Pallet	Similar sizes stack face-in. Rotate stack.
Microwaves	Palletize	Similar sizes stack face-in. You can break plastic stabilizer to maximize efficiencies.
Misc. e-wast (Small)	Gaylord or e-Racks	Any order. Make sure to fill empty spaces.
Misc. e-waste (Med. to Large)	e-Racks	Any order. Make sure to fill empty spaces.
